The Chair outlined the purpose of the Citizenship Loss Board is to support the Secretary of the Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIBP) and the Minister for Immigration and Border Protection in administering the citizenship loss provisions.

The Chair also reminded the Board it is an inter-departmental committee providing advice, and is not a decision-making body.

The Board **discussed** the complexities of building a case for citizenship loss.
