Section	Explanation
s128	Provides a power to cancel permanent and temporary visas of foreign nationals who are outside Australia if the minister (or delegate) is satisfied that: * There is a ground for cancelling the visa under section 116 * It is appropriate to cancel <b>the</b> visa without notice to the visa holder ( <i>eg. the circumstances are such that if the visa holder attempted to enter Australia, it is likely that his or her visa would be cancelled, and he or she may be refused immigration clearance and removed from Australia</i> )
s109	Provides for cancellation on the basis that the visa holder provided incorrect information or a bogus document
s116	Provides general and prescribed grounds for cancellation of visas (eg. breach of visa condition)
s134	Provides for the cancellation of business visas
s137J	Provides for the automatic cancellation of student visas
s137Q	Provides for the cancellation of regional sponsored employment visas
s137T	Consequential cancellation of visas held by a person because they are a member of a family unit of another person who's visa was cancelled
s140	Consequential cancellation of visas held by dependant visa holders when the visa held by the primary application is cancelled
s164	Provides for the cancellation of criminal justice visas
s501	Provides for cancellation based on character grounds
s501F	Consequential cancellation of visas based on the refusal of other visa applications
