CCF EMAIL GATEWAY TYPE 3 DIGITAL CERTIFICATE ROLLOVER 2010

This information is intended for Type 3 digital certificate holders using EDI software to access the Integrated Cargo System (ICS).

The existing Type 3 digital certificate used by the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service will expire on 23 September 2010, and Customs and Border Protection will be 'rolling over' to a newly issued certificate on **Wednesday, 8 September 2010**.

This means that users who send messages to the ICS (in both Industry Test and Production), using Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) software, need to rollover to the new Customs and Border Protection certificate.

Organisations who only use Customs Interactive (the web-based component of the ICS), or who use the services of a bureau will not be affected by the rollover and will not need to take any action.

Important: This rollover does not affect any digital certificates that you or your organisation may have purchased.

What should I do?

This advice should be forwarded to the person or area responsible for the maintenance of your EDI software, such as IT support, to make them aware of the upcoming rollover.

8 September, 2010 will see Customs and Border Protection start to encrypt all outbound messages with the new CCF Gateway certificate. **ALL USERS MUST** install the new public key before midnight on **7 September, 2010** in order to receive messages from Customs and Border Protection.
