C71641 Add 'Print NPD' button to Import Declaration Navigation Options View Screen

The Notice to Produce Documents (NPD) print will be available to external users via a print button on the Import Declaration Navigation Options View Screen. The print will be sent as a PDF attachment to an email address as per other ICS prints.

The NPD print contains information such as contact details for a Customs and Border Protection officer and document requirement details (see below for a sample NPD print). The information contained in the print is equivalent to that supplied in the EDI 'DOCS' message.

C95864 FCX cargo – HELD CARST transmissions

There is an issue for FCX Cargo where a HELD Cargo Status Advice (CARST) is not being transmitted to the Container Terminal Operator (CTO) when status has changed from a consolidated 'CLEAR' back to 'HELD'.

When all FCX bills are subsequently withdrawn after a Consolidated CLEAR Cargo Status has been transmitted to a CTO, a status of 'HELD' was not being transmitted from the ICS.

This change allows for a 'HELD' status to be sent to the CTO in these circumstances.

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C64947 Update of Cargo Status after Tranship Underbond is deleted

Previously the deletion of an underbond movement for reason 'TSH' (tranship) did not update the Cargo status (status remains as 'tranship) for both air and sea consignments.

This change will update the Cargo Status to the relevant value and also revoke the transhipment number (Customs Authority Number).
